

Renewal and updating of the Eilvese village maps, 2025.

In July 2011, the Eilvese Village Chronicle Association donated four village maps for our village. They are located at the train station (in front of the bicycle shelter), on Balschenweg (in front of the railway underpass), at Loh, and in the village center (monument).

Since then, a lot has changed in our village due to new construction areas. The village maps need to be updated.

On May 11, 2023, the US couple Tom and Pam Arrigo visited Eilvese. They visited the hometown of Pam's great-grandparents (source: Eilvese Village Chronicle, former farmsteads 11 + 12).

Our association organized the day in Eilvese for the couple. The Arrigos expressed their gratitude with a generous donation and asked that the amount be used in a way that would benefit the village community.

This donation was the catalyst for us launching the project to renew the town maps. At pma-Werbetchnik, we were fortunate enough to have the highly interested Joshua Hansen (who grew up in Eilvese) design this town map in collaboration with Axel Schlicker and Hartmut Neumann. Schuster (Mr. Büscher) installed the three town maps into the existing metal frames.

The village center location (as of timber construction) was completely renovated and adapted to the current dimensions of the new town map, and the town map was installed. This work was carried out voluntarily by master carpenter Otto Schröder, Jannis Honsa, and Hartmut Neumann. The QR code on the town signs is maintained by the "Citizens for Eilvese" association.

Since April 1, 2025, four modernized and updated town signs have been in place in Eilvese. Funded by donations from the Arrigo couple, the Eilvese Local Council, and the Eilvese Village Chronicle Association.
